Instructions for Spring Migrant Form

Fill in the county, compiler, and year at the top of the form

For transient migrant species which **do not** breed in your county, enter the earliest date each species was seen in the “First Date” column and the last date seen in the “Last Date” column.

For Wintering birds in your county, enter the latest date seen in the “Last Date” column.

For Breeding birds in your county, enter the first date seen in the “First Date” column

Therefore:

Non-wintering Breeders will have only a “First Date” (ie. Yellow Warbler)

Non-breeding wintering birds will have only a “Last Date” (ie. Northern Shrike, Evening Grosbeak)

Transient migrants will have both (ie. Connecticut Warbler)

Date should be entered as MM/DD. ie. April 5 would be entered as 4/5, May 26 would be entered as 5/25, etc.

(Do not enter the year. Do not spell out the month)

The “Spring” Migration starts in February (Grackles, Vultures, etc.) and ends in June. There are no precise start and stop dates.

NOTE: Greyed out cells in the “Last Date” column are species that nest in the state, though not in all counties.

If that species nests in your county, it should not have a “last date” in the Spring. If it does **not** nest in your county, then fill in a Last Date, if you have one. Refer to the *Breeding Bird Atlas* to confirm which species nest in your county.

Greyed out cells in the “First Date” column are species that regularly winter in the state, though not in all counties. If the species winters in your county, then it should not have a “First Date” in the Spring. If it didn't winter in your county, then enter the first date it was seen this spring.

This form should be submitted with your Spring Season (March-May) report. **Due June 30.**

Special Instructions for filling in the spreadsheet version of the report form

1. There are two versions of the form. **SpringMigrantForm.WB3** is in Quattro Pro format (preferred) and **SpringMigrantForm.xls** is in Microsoft Excel format.
2. **DO NOT add or delete any rows** on the spreadsheet. This is so Wendy can copy and paste the data intact and it will match her species list by row..
3. Enter the dates as shown above. (ie. 4/5, 5/26, etc.) The cells are already formatted, but if they lose their format, re-format them to Short International Date. (ie. MM/YY)
4. Save the spreadsheet as Spring(year)(county). Ie. Spring2002York, Spring2003Indiana, etc.
