Description...The Eurasian Wigeon was seen feeding with approx. 200 American Wigeon. The basic shape of the body and bill color identified it as a wigeon. It was a male in almost complete alternate definitive plumage. The bill was powder blue, the forehead and crown were buff, the entire head and neck was a rich reddish-bown with no indication of moult here. The breast was dingy pink, the flanks were gray with some feathers missing and the upper flank feathers that covered the wings were brown. The white patch in the ventral region was indistinct. The upper and undertail coverts were black. The central undertail coverts still had pale basic feathers remaining. The mantle and scapulars were gray. The scapulars were not completely developed as only a few long feathers with black cetral shafts were showing.

The bird was viewed at leisure at a distance of about 200 yards with the sun shining on the bird. Other birds feeding in the pond were 700 or more Ring-necked Duck, 8 to 10 Canvasback, 1 male Redhead, 1 female Pintail, 15 to 20 Mallards, 5 or 6 Black Duck, 15 to 20 Gadwall, 75 to 100 American Coot, and 12 to 15

Pied-billed Grebe.
