Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)

The only other similar species I have observed is Wilson's Storm-Petrel. This bird was longer-winged with a forked tail and differently shaped rump patch, as described above. Its flight style was markedly different. Band-rumped Storm-Petrel, another very similar species (although one which I have not personally observed) should have a less forked tail and a thick U-shaped white rump patch.

Discussion - anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it:

This bird was seen during Hurricane Sandy. Many other Leach's Storm-Petrels were reported on the Delaware River and elsewhere in Pennsylvania on the same day.
