Snowing to partly sunny, 30F, some frozen areas

Unquestionably a pelican, with large head held back over body on relatively thick neck, and huge orange bill. It was white with black wing tips. Being from the south, I have seen many pelicans throughout my life and would not mistake one for anything else.

The bird was first seen over the lake about 50 yards from the dam and flying towards the dam. Approximately over the dam and about 50 yards from the observer, it veered away and flew along the line of the dam, which would have taken it over the bridge over Rt. 422.

Unfortunately I did not look for field marks to distinguish American White Pelican from an Eastern White Pelican of Europe. At its closest point to the observer, about 50 yards, it would have been easy to determine how far into the secondaries the black went, and also probably to see the feathering around the eye.

The bird was observed with the naked eye and with Celestron 9.5x44 ED binoculars.
