(Description) Looking to the east from the Julian Wetlands, I saw a large bird in the distance flying away from me. I immediately noted the long, down-curved bill of an ibis. The bird had a long neck, fully extended straight to the head. Field marks observed were a white rump extending to white tail (not just the rump, like a NOHA would have), a thin white stripe along the length of each wing but in the center (not the leading or trailing edges), white on front of neck and on belly, and gray-black coloring on upperparts. Jizz was that of an ibis, while plumage suggested to me (and to others to whom I described the bird) a juvenile White Ibis. Unfortunately, I didn't have a camera. The bird was well off the wetlands when I spotted it, flying away from me.

(Behavior) Bird was simply in flight; it circled over the valley for some time, enabling me to note field marks. It flew due east away from the Julian Wetlands and toward Julian PA. I watched it from the time it was perhaps a quarter-mile away until I could no longer see it.


