Subject:	American Swallowtailed Kite - McKean County

At about 4:50pm an adult American Swallow-tailed Kite was observed flying across the road about 1/4 to 1/2 mile south of the entrance to the Sugar Bay Boat Launch on Route 321 in McKean County. I was just leaving after checking out Sugar Bay for hurricane vagrants and coming up with good shorebirds but no ' storm birds'. My first thought was an Osprey (about the right size) then it went to Magnificent Frigate bird when I saw the tail, but after realizing that the wing linings were white underneath, the only candidate left is American Swallowtail kite. After consulting my field guides, I am 100% absolutely sure POSITIVE that it was an adult Swallow-tailed Kite! I did not see any barring on the underside so I am sure it was an adult. The bird was flying low down and across the road and may have landed as I went back and scanned the air and ridgetops and turned up nothing. I did not expect this bird although I had hoped for other vagrants, but I am not complaining.

The bird was white headed, white bellied, white wing linings, black looking above, black flight feathers under, and a black swallow tail.
