Description	All white bird, long tail, long narrow pointed wings. We saw the under-side and right side of the bird, only, as it flew over our field directly in front of us. Were not able to note eye color, and can't even say that we noticed the black shoulder patches. We are familiar with the flight pattern and jizz of White-tailed Kites.

Behavior (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing)	The bird was flying across the field in front of us at an estimated height of 100 feet, just above the trees to the left of our viewing area, and continued for 4 or 5 seconds across the open field until it disappeared just over the trees to the right of our viewing area. It was headed on a NE to SW direction.
Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)	Our reaction when we first became aware of the bird as it was behind the trees to our left was that it was our regular Cooper's Hawk that we see daily. But as it cleared the trees and we could see it clearly, both Jewel and I exclaimed simultaneously, "White-tailed Kite," as we were both absolutely certain. We have seen Mississippi Kites, but they are much darker underneath. Nothing else is close.
Discussion – anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it:	We are both well familiar with White-tailed Kites as we have seen them in Florida, Texas and California. Our daughter lives north of San Diego and has a pair of White-tailed Kites in the preserved open space behind her house, which we have watched and photographed extensively when we have visited her. In Florida, we spent two days studying a White-tailed Kite when I took most of the photos (one photo is from CA) in my blog article at: http://stlucieaudubon.org/hartBeat/hb2012/hb120915Kites.html
