I have seen many hawks and eagles from this location, which looks northeast. They seem to come from the northeast heading southwest, skirting Philadelphia, on their way south. I happened to look up and saw a soaring bird a little higher than the tall oaks in the neighborhood. The bird was doing a little flapping but mostly soaring, and my initial impression was of a nighthawk. Since it was around 11:20 AM, it seemed to be an unusual time to see a nighthawk. I quickly grabbed my Zeiss bins and, looking at the bird which was about a half block away, quickly realized it was not a nighthawk. From this distance the bird was all dark with pointed falcon-like wings. The bird disappeared behind another oak tree; my mind was racing over what this could be, and I was running around the yard to try to get a better look at this bird. In my mind I was starting to wonder if this could be a Mississippi Kite! Finally the bird came out in view, closer this time, and the bird appeared all dark grey with a paler gray head. Yes, a Mississippi Kite! The kite disappeared as quickly as it came into view. I hopped into my car to give chase, but never did find the bird again.

I believe the bird was an adult or near adult as no barring was visible in the tail. It appeared dark grey overall with the exception of the light grey head and throat area. The tail was dark and slightly notched (as noted in The Birds of North America). The bird was bigger than a Merlin or Kestrel, but not as big or powerful as a Peregrine. The flight was non-falcon like, being unhurried, soaring and gliding rather than a strong, direct flight.

At the time of the observation the sky was cloudy and dark, not kite weather. But within 15 minutes the sky cleared and the sun was shining brightly. I believe the kite was taking advantage of the front that was blowing through and riding the strong winds south.

Hard to believe, a Swallow-tailed and Mississippi Kite in Montgomery County all within one month.
