Holly reported seeing this bird on the afternoon of Sept 12 and again at 11am on Sept 13 when she was able to make the attached photos and confirm the ID.

Unknown. I did not see the bird for myself.

Holly told me she saw the bird in flight and perched and personally showed me the areas she saw the bird and described the encounter. I found her report to be credible. While searching for the bird myself, I also had two separate discussions with local residents (non-birders) who noticed an unusual "white-headed vulture" feeding with Turkey Vultures on a groundhog carcass just a few feet from Pleasant Valley Road earlier in the morning on Sep 13.

Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)

I did not see the bird for myself. I offer only Holly's photos.

Discussion – anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it:

I found Holly's report to be credible in discussions with her.

Although the specific spot where Holly saw the bird is not similar habitat to this species' typical preference in its normal range, there were several open fields nearby including one active dairy farm directly adjacent to the sighting area (on a hillside above). In fact we spent just as much time checking these open areas in our attempt to recover this bird as we did checking the original sighting location. However, despite commencing a continuous search until dusk just two hours after Holly's final sighting on Sept 13 and searching for the entire morning the next day as well, nobody recovered the bird.

Holly offered to provide more details of the sighting if needed.
