Description	<p>Copied from eBird:</p> <p>Red Phalarope Remove Species A disheveled looking bird, in molt from basic to alternate plumage. Blended in very well with the mud, too far for a picture. Mottled above, some hints of red coming through, on flanks and particularly under rump (Red-necked would show white under rump - good point by Paul Driver) Bill was what first clued me into ID - thicker/stouter than Red-necked. Structurally it reminded me strongly of the bird found last fall at Green Lane, which I spent a lot of time studying before IDing.</p>

<b>Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)</b>	Bill stouter/thicker than Red-necked phalarope. Red coming through under rump - Red-necked would show white under rump.
