alternate plumage but had lost the red orbital ring it shows earlier in the spring and summer. The tail was slightly forked.

Behavior (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing)

The bird spent the whole day alternating between sitting on the water rather far out and giving stunning views very close to the sidewalk rail at the spillway concession area as it came in close to scrum with the local Ring-bills and Mallards for thrown bread. Seen exceptionally well.

Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)

The combination of the described upper wing pattern and yellow-tipped bill on a hooded gull is distinctive. Gray mantle (instead of scalloped brown) indicates adult (rather than juvenile) Sabine's Gull.

Discussion – anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it:

The bird was originally found by Mark Vass on the afternoon of Sept 5. It was still present all day on Sept 6 and I observed it from 9:30 am until 6pm that day. It was present again on Sept 7 and I observed it again from about 3:00pm until 5:30pm. At 5:30pm on Sept 7, the bird flew off toward the lake west of the spillway (previously it had spent nearly all of its time on the east side) and surprisingly was not seen at the spillway again. There was a second hand report that it was seen and photographed a few days later near the Pymatuning causeway but I cannot vouch for this report.

When I had arrived the bird was about 200 yards out into the spillway. An older woman had arrived with a loaf of bread in which the Sabine's flew to within several feet of birders present. It would catch bread out of the air as the woman threw it or dive into the water in attempts to snatch it from the carp and ducks.

When the bread supply had dwindled, the bird flew back to the location it was spotted at when I arrived, about 200 yards out and could only be observed through a scope.

Distinctively smaller than ring-billed gulls all around. Very bright white, with bold black triangles on upper wings. Head was dark gray and beak had yellow tip. Black border of head briefly noted, but difficult to distinguish in very poor lighting.

Behavior (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing)

Upon arrival, bird maintained a great distance from spillway. Then a large group of individuals started throwing bread in for birds and carp. Gull immediately took notice and headed straight for large group of mallards/ring-billed gulls battling for bread. Sabine's slightly more aggressive, and quicker, than ring-billed gulls. Very quick to dive into group of mallards for meal. After a few minutes, flew away from commotion and floated for awhile. Repeated this two more times (float, food, float).
