## **DOCUMENTATION OF SIGHT RECORD -- Paul Hess**

Black-headed Gull (Larus ridibundus) -- 1 basic definitive

DATE: 1 December 2000 TIME: 1130

LOCATION: Presque Isle, Erie County, Pennsylvania; lake waters south of Leo's Landing.

OBSERVER: Paul Hess, 1412 Hawthorne St., Natrona Heights PA 15065 (other observer Sam Sinderson)

CONDITIONS: cloudy, but bright enough to see general plumage features at 200 yards.

OPTICS AND OBSERVATION: 8x32 Leica binoculars. We watched the bird in flight over the water for about 10 minutes at distances from 200 yards to as close as 25 yards.

## **DESCRIPTION:**

Size -- slightly but noticeably larger in wingspan, length, and general bulk than the Bonaparte's Gulls flying over the water in the same area.

Plumage -- body and tail entirely white; head white with prominent dark spot behind eye and two faint dusky "stripes" extending from upper face across the crown; mantle light gray; upperwings the same light gray with a white wedge across primaries and black primary tips that gave a narrow dark edge to the outer wing; underwings dark dusky on the outer portion and when the bird wheeled at close range the inner portion appeared much paler or even whitish.

Bill and legs -- red.

SEPARATION FROM SIMILAR SPECIES: The gull differed conspicuously from the nearby Bonaparte's in its larger size, dark primaries on the underwings, and at close range the red bill.

COMMENTS: This was a remarkably quick discovery. We had just gotten out of Sam's car, and I raised my binoculars to begin scanning the flying gulls. In the first instant I was looking straight at this bird, immediately saw its dark underwings, yelled "Black-headed Gull" to Sam, and he quickly found it too.

EXPERIENCE WITH THE SPECIES: It was my third Black-headed in North America. The previous two were in December 1998 at Niagara Falls, Ontario, and Lake Arthur, Butler County, Pa. All three were in basic definitive plumage. I saw countless Black-headed Gulls during two trips to Europe in the 1960s and 1970s, but most were in alternate plumage.

This account is written 4 December 2000, from brief notes made just after the sighting.
