### LITTLE GULL

#### Larus minutus

Location: Pymatuning Lake

Details: While watching a small gathering of flying gulls, on the Linesville Christmas count near the Jamestown dam at Pymatuning Lake, my attention was attracted to a smaller bird that had joined a flock of Bonaparte's. It was similar in appearance to the first winter Bonaparte's in the flock, its wings showing a strong blackish W, but the gull was perhaps only two-thirds the size of a Bonaparte's. The bird's bill appeared proportionately smaller to head size than that of the Bonaparte's, and the bird was more tern-like in its flight pattern. As the bird approached the shore, within 60 feet of me, I was able to see that the bird's crown was blacker than that of any of the Bonaparte's, and the primaries were blackish above. I was able to study the bird for about ten minutes, before it disappeared over the dam, into the Shenango River area. I was briefly joined by my brother, Ronald Leberman, who was able to view the bird for a few moments before it disappeared. This is apparently the first report of a Little Gull from Crawford County, Pennsylvania.
