Description: The Little Gull was an adult in winter plumage, feeding with a large (60-80) flock of Bonaparte's Gulls between 100-300 yards out over the water. The underwing was an unmistakable, dark, uniform slate gray, with clean white tips and trailing edge. The mantle was light gray, the legs were red, and the head was mottled, with the hood still undefined. The presence of the Boneparte's Gulls provided an unbeatable comparison. While the dark underwing was evident to the naked eye, I spent over 20 minutes watching the bird feed through the binoculars and scope. It was one of the last birds in the flock to settle down on the surface just after 6:00.
