Dear John,

Thank you for submitting documentation on the Franklin's Gulls near Carrolltown on 12 May 1997. After careful review, the committee regrets that it cannot accept this record. Three committee members considered the record acceptable, but four others believed that the details of the description did not adequately eliminate other species that would have black heads in the spring, such as Laughing and Black-headed. The rosy breast tint did point to Franklin's, but Grant cautioned in *Gulls: a Guide to Identification*, "Exceptionally, some individuals of normally non-pink or slightly pink species (such as Black-headed Gull) may be strongly pink-toned."

The committee emphasizes that non-acceptance does not mean that the bird was not the species reported, but rather that the committee believes the documentation submitted does not support the identification conclusively.

We hope that this will not discourage you from submitting documentation on any rarities you may find in the future.

Finally, the committee apologizes for the unacceptably long delay before all members were able to vote on the record. Circumstances beyond our control caused the problem, and we believe that we are back on a timely track.
