I had just received a phone call from Jason Horn when I arrived at the river on the New Jersey side (It's a better view from that side) to see what was around. We were chatting as I got out of my truck, walked over to the river and got to a spot where I had a good view. When I got there, I first looked down river naked eyed and spotted a small white bird flying upstream. I got it in the binoculars and immediately saw that it was a Least Tern! I said to Jason something like "Holy s--, I gotta go." and grabbed my camera. I got about 40 pictures as it came past me, headed over to the PA side and continued upstream. After it went out of sight, I tried to relocate it but never saw it again. In the photos the yellow bill, white forehead and black primaries on the leading edge of the wing are visible

Typical tern behavior, flying over the water.

Small size, yellow bill, white forehead and black primaries eliminate everything else
