	slightly beyond the rest of the tail. A total of three showed long, blunt, twisted central tail feathers.
Behavior (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing)	The birds appeared in two flocks. The first flock consisted of 7 birds and the second flock, of 12 birds, turned up 45 minutes later. Both flocks headed down river and, upon approaching the Commodore Barry Bridge, turned west and flew over land (and out of sight) rather than fly over or under the bridge. Several birds were seen harrassing Herring Gulls in flight.
Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)	The birds we saw were significantly heftier than both Parasitic and Long-tailed jaegers. Three displayed long, blunt, twisted central retrices.
