Seen several times over 2 days, and was always on its own - did not hang out with the Feral Pigeons or Mourning Doves. Seen perched and would fly when approached. Did not see it eating, but there is lots

	of spilled feed available.
Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)	Squared off tail separated it from Mourning Dove. Shape, behavior and plumage, specifically the white edge to the wing and the malar streak, eliminated Feral Pigeon. White wing-edge and location of marking on neck (malar, vs back of neck) eliminated Eurasian Collared Dove.
