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POSSIBLE BLACH-BACKED WOODPECKER REPORT Binder: Joanna D. Stickler R.1, Box 307, Lawrenceville, PA 16929

Date: May 23, 1996, about 4:45 PM; Location: East Lawrence Cemetery, located 3 1/2 miles east of Rte. 15 on East Lawrence Rd., Lawrence Twp., Tiega County, PA. Weather: bright overcast; visibllity clear, not hazy; just starting to sprinkle slightly.

Particulars of sighting: Bird flew past me from a group of locust trees to a large single old maple with much dead and dying wood; distance 40 to 60 feet; I had no pipoculars, but lighting conditions made bird's lack of common woodpecker-Sype samilings very noticeable. As bird flew from in front of me to the left and away, it had typical undulating woodpecker flight style. swiveled, saw it land, centered on the trunk, about 5 feet up on a buge maple; bird's back was toward me and it looked about the size and color of a starling; no visible markings. But it climbed up the trunk woodpecker fashion and around to the left to present a profile; definitely woodpecker, with a fairly slender neck and light colored underside, but no other apparent markings up back, nape, top of head, or throat. As it went behind the trunk, 1 but ied about 20 feet closer. When it reappoared, it was startled that I was so near, and flew directly away, showing just a tiny flash of something white in the tail. It flaw across a creek and into mixed evergreen-hardwood forest. Then, rain shower began. At all times the bird had a background of tree or forest ne sky.

THIS IS DEFINITELY THE WRONG TIME OF YEAR FOR A BLACK-BACKED WOOODPECKER TO BE FOUND IN PA. However, upon analysis of Fabitat, size, completely black back, hape and top of head, and the fact that it was a woodpecker, I had to conclude that it was a fenale Black-backed Woodpecker.

Unfortunately, that area was the site of heavy traffic with grave digging machinery and tuneral proceedings for the next several days. My personal schedule did out permit me to relurn there until 5/31. Returned to cenetery at 5 PM; found a Vellowbellied Sapsucker not far from that area. May 25 sighting couldn't have been a YBSA. YBSA isn't black on the tack, has very noticeable white facial markings and wing stripe, Also, if was too early in season for a darker im. YBSA here; (cur first YBSAs of year arrived April 22; they require at least 5 weeks to nest and fledge young.'

June 17, 1996: Checked out cemetery area; found no woodpeckers of any kind, but noted a good selection of other regular summer species.
