Dear Lawrence,

Thank you for submitting documentation on the Black-backed Woodpecker at Millerton on 28 November 1998. After careful review, the committee regrets that it cannot accept this record. One member voted to accept it, but the majority declined because they felt that much more plumage detail was needed for certainty, including the exact appearance of a moustache stripe, the flanks, and the face. They also were troubled by the description of its size as "slightly larger" than a Downy Woodpecker (Black-backed is quite a hefty-appearing bird even larger than a Hairy), and "gray sides" (not typical for a Black-backed, which would show heavily barred sides). Some of the members felt that it might have been one of the very dark, i.e. melanistic, Hairy Woodpeckers which sometimes occur.

The committee emphasizes that non-acceptance does not mean that the bird was not the species reported, but rather that the committee believes the documentation submitted does not support the identification conclusively.

We hope that this will not discourage you from submitting documentation on any rarities you may find in the future.

Finally, the committee apologizes for the unacceptably long delay before all members were able to vote on the record. Circumstances beyond our control caused the problem, and we believe that we are back on a timely track.
