The bird was an obvious kingbird (see photo). The throat and upper breast were white. Te belly was yellow. The back was grayish. The top of the head was grayish. It had dark lores, giving it an almost masked appearance. The wings and tail were dark. When it flew the outer web of the outer tail feathers was white. There were no other markings on the tail. The tail pattern ruled out Cassin's, Couch's, and Tropical Kingbirds. Also, the bill was not as heavy as Tropical or Couch's. The white throat and upper breast ruled out Cassin's.


