I stopped at Kinzua Dam about 4pm to scan the 30 + gulls on the railing and flying around - all Ring-bills and I noticed 2 Swallows, 2 became 5 and I started to get excited. The distance at one point was within about 30 feet. The throat was pale - with a slight rufous coloration and the forehead was slightly darker rufousy colored - definitely not pale white - and extended back to at least the back end of the eye and in front of the eye to the bill and blended in with the throat. There was no dark coloration below the eye or on the ear patch and the color was roughly the same as the throat. The collar was lighter than the throat and the rump seemed slightly rufous! The belly was white and the flanks had just a smudge of rufous. The tail was squared. All of them looked to be the same age group and all had similar coloration. They proceeded to go downstream toward Warren and may have been heading toward a roost as the sun was already behind the hills. I believe I had 5 Cave Swallows, but I do not know what race. I think setting up on the dam overlook or at the spillway in the morning might pay off. Go east on Rt 59 from Warren for approximately 6 to 7 miles.
