BIRD WAS SMALL & 4-5 INCHES, APPROX. SIZE AND SHAPE OF HOUSE WEEN. BILL SHORT. WHITISH EYEBRON EVIDENT. WPFERPARTS MOSTLY BROWN. DISTINCT WHITE
STREAKING ON BACK AND CROWN. THROAT WHITISH . UNDER PARTS BUTTY . WINGS
SMALL. FLIGHT VERY WEAK, TAIL SHORT AND HELD ERECT.

BEHAVIOR (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing) MALE WAS EASILY HEARD, BUT OTHELWISE NOT EASILY ORSELVED. WILLO OFTEN SINE CONTINUOUSLY FLOM CONCEALED PERCH. RARELY PERCHED NEAR TOP OF ELASS. BEST OBSERVED WHEN FLYING HUST ABOVE GRASS FROM PERCH TO PERCH.
FUGHT WEAK AND ALMOST FLUTTERING. DIFFICULT TO IMAGINE THIS BIRD MIGRATES ANY
DISTANCE AFTER SEEING IT FLY. FEMALE WAS EVEN MORE SECRETIVE. (CONT)
VOCALIZATIONS MALE WILLD SING ALMOST CONTINUOUSLY AT TIMES, UP TO 10 TIMES/MINUTE, ESPECIALLY MORNING AND EVENING. MIDDRY WOULD HAVE PERIODS OF SINGING INTERSPERSED WITH SIGNE, MALE WOULD ALTERNATE BETWEEN TWO OPSTINITIVE BONGS. PRIMARY SONG A TWO NOTE "DIK DIK" FOLLOWED BY A DRY RATTLE LASTING 3-5 SECONDS. (CONT)

ON 6/20/04, OBSELVED MALE CALLYING NESTING MATERIAL NEAR SPOT WHERE FEMALE WAS HEARD CALLING. ON 7/13/04, WATCHED MALE CARRYING NESTING MATERIAL AT ANOTHER LOCATION (APPROX. 30 METERS AWAY FROM PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED SITE) (GOME) (Please use an additional page if necessary)

#### BEHAVOIR

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BEHAVOIR WAS ALMOST MOUSE-LIKE, OBSERVED AT CLOSE RANGE SEVERAL TIMES SUNKING CAUTIOUSLY THROUGH GRASS. RANELY SAW FEMALE FLYING ABOVE TOP OF GRASS,

#### YOILE

SECONDARY SONG WAS THE SAME TWO NOTE "DIK DIK" FOLLOWED BY A MUCH MORE MUSICAL TRILL, SOUNDING SOMEWHAT LIKE A TINY BELL RINGING. VOICE WAS LOUD, EASILY HEALD AT 100+ METERS.
FEMALES CALL WAS A TWO NOTE "DIK DIK", SIMILIAR IN QUALITY TO MALE. AT CLOSE RANGE, FEMALE ALSO GAVE A LOW, GUTTERAL "BRRR BRRR", POSSIBLY A AGITATION CALL.
