Sedge Wren 6/30/2005 Philadelphia

I went to look for the Sedge Wren that been reported from northwest Philadelphia the past few days. When I arrived the bird was singing from about 50 yes away but not visible. The song was clearly that of a Sedge Wren with two introductory notes followed by trill. After about 15 minutes the bird flew and landed a top a small bush.

General description: a small brown wren, buffy-brown above with a small white eyeline and buffy-brown throat. There appeared to be a few vertical brown and white stripes on the back. The underparts were plain buffy-brown with a whitish throat. The bill was short and the tail was short.

The bird strayed in the open for about 2-3 minutes singing continuously, then flew down and remained hidden from view but frequently singing for the next 15-20 minutes. The bird never showed itself again.

Other observers: Frank Windfelder was present during most of the viewing time.

The song separates this species from other small wrens.
