

TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE

Myadestes townsendi Revere, Bucks County 3/22-23/1993 Franklin C. Haas

A Townsend's Solitaire was found by Steve Farbotnick on his property in Revere, Bucks County, Pennsylvania on 3/22/93. I saw the bird on 3/23/93. The following were noted.

- 1. The bird was gray above and paler gray below.
- 2. It had a white eye-ring.
- 3. Buffy wing patches were noticeable when it flew.
- 4. It had white outer tail feathers.
- 5. It was slightly larger than Eastern Bluebirds which were also in the immediate area.
- 6. Although the head and body were similar in shape to a bluebird, it had a much longer tail.

Discussion: The buffy wing patches ruled out Northern Mockingbird. No other species that I am aware of has the combination of size, shape, and markings noted above.
