After careful review, we regret that we are unable to accept this record. Some committee members suggested the possibility of a mimic or because of the unusual date, the possibility of a Black-throated Gray Warbler. A few committee members also felt uncomfortable accepting a record of a heard only species without a recording of the bird. This does not mean of course, that the bird was not a Black-throated Green Warbler, merely, that the details submitted do not allow for a concrete determination.

Sue Wetzel and myself, Linda Hepfner, were conducting a plot style winter bird census on March 19, 1995. This was a 15 hectare square plot located in Snyder Township, Jefferson County, PA. At location D3*we heard the song of a Black-Throated Green Warbler, "zee zee zee zoo zee". The bird repeated itself many times and we continued to hear it as we traversed to points D4 and D5. The bird did not sing any other version of its song. We did not have a visual sighting of the bird.

My background in bird identification by sound is as follows:

On May 16, 1994 I attended a course in identifying birds by sound and conducting bird censuses conducted by Dr. J. Christopher Haney and Dr. Charles Schaadt. The course was intense, meeting 5 days a week, 4:00am to 11:00am, and some evenings as well, and lasted through June 10, 1994. During this period, the sounds of a Black-Throated Green Warbler were heard many times, at several locations. According to my notes taken at that time, locations included plots at Treasure Lake, PA, Cooks' Forest, PA, Brockport I, PA. The Black-Throated Green Warbler was also sited at plot locations in Tionesta.

Audio tapes by Richard K. Walton & Robert W. Lawson, 1990, Peterson Field Guides, Eastern/Central Birding by Ear, have the songs of the Black-Throated Green Warbler included. I have listened to these tapes many times between summer of 1994 and March 1995.

I have participated in Winter Bird Counts for the 1994-95 season at locations in Cooks' Forest, and Brockport, PA.

Although I have not heard the Black-Throated Green Warbler call since last year, when I heard it on March 19, 1995, the recognition of this bird was immediate. The bird continued to sing, giving me the opportunity to verify the identification.

Dear Mr. Brauning,

I am a wildlife student at Penn State DuBois, PA. I have been informed by my professors Dr. Haney and Dr. Schaadt that you were interested in our recording of hearing a black-throated green warbler, which we heard on March 19, 1995. My knowledge of identifying birds accoustically is somewhat new, but I can assure you many hours were spent listening to just such birds.

My past experience consists of taking a very intense course the summer of 94. During this course we spent many hours in the field listening and recording birds, listening to tapes, and learning mnemonic sounds for the birds. One whole week was spent in Cook Forest going on census plots with the professors. During the winter of 94, 95 several students that took the course were asked to continue doing winter censuses on the plots in Cook Forest and Brockport. We also got together along with the help of Dr. Schaadt put in a new plot also in Brockport, (Brockport Two), which we took turns monitoring over the winter.

On March 19, 1995 Linda Hepfner and I decided to do a census on Brockport one. The day was clear and sunny with the temperature at about 40. We started the census at 8:07 am. We recorded many birds that morning before going down D-3 which is where we heard the black-throated green warbler. We stopped at the flag and recorded a brown creeper, a white-breasted nuthatch and a tufted titmouse. Then we heard it, "zee-zee-zee-zoo-zee". Linda and I both looked at each other and said at the same time "na it couldn't be". The tufted tit mouse was still calling and we heard it again "zee-zee-zee-zoo-zee". There is no mistaking that buzzy sound, we heard it so much over the summer it was burned into my brain. We recorded it and moved onto the next flag continuing to hear it sing for several more flags. I am certain what we heard was a black-throated green warbler.
