IF THIS IS A DEAD BIRD:

SEPARATION FROM SIMILAR SPECIES (how you eliminated others): All the common North American tanagers do not have wing bars except WETA. From Sibley: Flame colored tanager lacks streaking in the crown to the rump, is deeper yellow than Western and has large white spots on tertials.

DISCUSSION – Anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it (Please use an additional page if necessary) Not necessary, this is a straight forward ID. The pictures and field description are rather conclusive.

PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE WITH THIS AND/OR SIMILAR SPECIES: Scarlet tanager is a common breeding bird in the forests of PA of which I have recorded many for the breeding bird atlas. I have seen WETA in Texas and Colorado.
