A Red-throated Loon was a good find on Beaver Run Reservoir 4/14 (Ken Byerly), and a rather late Red-necked Grebe was at Donegal Lake 4/30 (Bob Leberman). A <u>Cattle</u> <u>Egret</u> at Turner's Pond, near Slickville 4/14 was one of very few county records (KB, Dennis Lauffer). The <u>Greater White-</u> <u>fronted Goose</u>, that had appeared in the Ligonier area in March, was last seen on a small pond at Laughlintown 4/1-2 (H. Moore).

794-02-1996

There was a major fallout of waterfowl in the Laurel Highlands 4/5. Every lake, reservoir and farm pond was "peppered" with ducks and grebes. At Donegal Lake, for example, Leberman estimated at least 4500 ducks--including 200+ Canvasback, 2500 Lesser Scaup, 200+ Oldsguaw, 350+ Bufflehead, and 600+ Ruddy Duck. There were two Whitewinged Scoter on Donegal that day; when Bob Mulvihill also found 2 White-wings on nearby Greenlick Dam and 2 on Mammoth Lake. A Black-bellied Plover on Beaver Run Reservoir 4/27 (DL) was an exceptional spring record for this region. A high count of 15 Forster's Tern was made at Donegal Lake 4/30 (KY Dick Byers); and a late Black Tern was there on 6/3 (BL). A back yard Northern Saw-whet Owl surprised Louise Carroll on 4/17 at Greensburg.

DL estimated 50 American Pipit at Slickville 4/11. Mary Shirland found a Brewster's Warbler at Murrysville 4/27; and a male Brewster's banded at Powdermill 5/30 was apparently a breeding bird that was recaptured 6/8. Another highlight of the PNR banding program was a Lawrence's Warbler 5/19. The only Orange-crowned Warbler was netted at PNR 5/9.

The bird of the season, however, was a <u>Painted Bunting</u>. A second-year bird in green plumage (but probably male based on measurements), was trapped and banded at PNR on 5/5 when it had no fat and weighed just under 14 g; it was rehandled several times through the 13th, when it was found to have very large fat deposits, and weighed just over 18 g. During this period the bird was seen by at least 50 observers. This was the first confirmed record of a wild <u>Painted</u> Bunting for southwestern Pennsylvania. Another regional Tarity, a <u>Clay-colored Sparrov</u> (second year male), was banded at PNR 5/15 and retrapped the next day. Helen Schmidt gave a good description of 2 Pine Grosbeak at her feeding station near Ligonier 4/17.
