LOOKING OUT MY KITCHEN DOORS, SCANNING THE YARD FOR BIRDS, I SAW SEVERAL GRACKIES AT THE GROUND FEEDER, ALONG WITH 6 MOURNING DONES, A PAIR OF CARDINALS AND SEVERAL HOUSE FINCHES. AT THE POLE FEEDER WARE 2 CHICKADEES, MORE HOUSE FINCHES AND A TUFTED TIT-MOUSE, BUT WHAT CAUGHT MY EYE AS SOMEWHAT UNUSUAL, WAS A SINGLE ICTORIO FORAGING IN THE LEAF COVERED TAN BARK AT THE BASE OF THE POLE MOUNTED FEEDER (CONTAINING A MIXTURE OF MIW, MILLET, CRACKED CORN AND BLACK OIL SUNFLOWER SEEDS).

UPON OBSERVIME THE BIRD WITH 10×40 SWIFT BINDCULAR'S AT 15 METERS, I NOTED THE BIRD'S SIZE TO BE THAT OF A STARLING OR RED-WINGED BLACKBIRD (NOTICEABLY SMAUGR THAN THE GRACKLE'S AT THE GROUND PEDOOR IS METERS AWAY) AND ITS TAIL WAS ONLY ONE-HAUF TO TWO THIRDS THE LENGTH OF THE GRACKLES, ITS' EYE STOOD OUT DISTINCTLY USRY PALE YELLOW, ALMOST WHITE. AS THE BIRD WOULD MOVE LEFT TO RIGHT IN THE MORNING SUN, ITS PURPLE GLOSSY HEAD WOULD SHINE AND ITS BACK WOULD ALSO REFLECT THE LIGHT.

BUT WITH A SOMEWHAT SUBDUED PURPLE GRACKIES.

I OBSERVED THE BIRD FOR WHAT SEEMED TO BE FIVE MINUTES, THEN ANOTHER GROUP OF GRACKIES FLEW INTO THE MACKBERRY TREE ABOVE THE BIRD AND IT TOOK FUENT OVER A 100 ACRE FIELD BORDERING MY PROPERTY AND WAS NOT SEEN AGAIN, I'M CONVINCED I WAS OBSERVED A BREWELS BUCKBIRD.
