Description

Defined light gray hood, bright brown flanks and back. Obvious striation in back wing feathers. Noticeably smaller than the other, Slate-Colored birds, which were behaving aggressively towards it

Behavior (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing)

Eating black oil sunflower seed at the platform feeders on its own. Any other junco who arrived on a particular feeder chased it off

Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)

Definitely a Junco - not a Slate-colored because of obvious hood, distinct brown flanks, not a Pink-sided due to face being too dark, without dark black lores. Not a Cassiar because flanks bright brown instead of grayish brown, bright brown back

Discussion – anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it:

Among the many Slate-Colored Dark-Eyed Juncos that come to our yard, I regularly see a few that are probably Cassiar Slate-colored birds, but this one had much bolder colors and a more distinct hood.

I am not 100% positive because I am not an expert on subtle differences between subspecies, though I learned a lot by talking with people
