## Yellow-rumped (Audubon's) Warbler

Dendroica coronata

Location: Presque Isle State Park

Date: May 7; 1994

Time: Approximately 5:00 to 5:10 PM

Weather: Cloudy (stratus), light rain, visibility fair

Details of sighting and description of bird: Ed Kwater and his wife Cheryl, and I was looking through a flock of warblers that were slowly moving eastward along Sidewalk Trail when Ed shouted, "Audubon's Yellow-rumped." He described the general area where he saw it, but by the time I located the bird it dropped out of sight in some thick vegetation. A few moments later I spotted a warbler moving into view in the spot where the "Audubon's" had disappeared. When it flew into better position for me to see, I also readily identified the bird as a female Yellow-rumped "Audubon's" Warbler. It was feeding with a few Yellow-rumped "Myrtle" Warblers making comparison fairly easy. The most distinctive field mark of the "Audubon's" was its throat which was a medium to light lemon yellow. The mantle and face were medium bluish-gray. The blue-gray was much brighter on the "Audubon's" than on the female "Myrtle's." Aside from those two field marks, the "Audubon's" looked very much like the Myrtle's. The upper breast was lightly streaked and the streaking continued down the flanks. There was a yellow patch on both sides of the breast which was the same tone of yellow as that on the throat. The belly and undertail coverts were white. The upper wing coverts were bluish-gray the same as the mantle and head and the wing coverts were edged in white forming two narrow wing bars. There were distinctive white eyelets above and below each eye. The face lacked any indication of a pale supercillium. There was an indistinct yellow patch on the crown. The rump was a bright lemon yellow contrasting sharply with the bluish-gray mantle and tail. I have seen many "Audubon's" in the western United States and this is the second female I have seen in Erie Co.

AUDUBON'S YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER IN ERIE COUNTY
ED KWATER

On Saturday May 7th 1994 I was birding along Side-walk Trail, Presque Isle State Park, Erie Co. with my wife Cheryl and Jerry Mc williams when we paused to look through a small flock of worklers (Parulidae). A bird suddenly appeared showing a bright yellow throat patch and I realised I was looking at a Yellow-numped workler, of the western race auduboni commonly referred to as Audubon's Workler. The bird remained on view for several minutes at eye level and at a distance of only about thirty feet allowing up to get some good views.

The most striking thing about the burd was the head patter. The basic head color was blue-gray, slightly dorker in the facial area, with conspicuous white eyelets (crescents) above and below the eye. There was a small yellow certral crown patch. The chin and. throat were bright yellow with a sharp demarkation between the throat and breast. The Hanks were streaked with black on a white background and there was a yellow patch on each upper flank. The markle was grayish - brown streaked with black. The rump patch was bright yellow and conspicuous. The tail was dark gray with white oval spots in the outer rectrices, noticeable only when the bird flew but they could be seen on the undertail when the bird was at rest. The wings were dark grow with two white wing bors formed by the tips of the median and greater coverts
