

The Common Teal has appeared in Winter at Peace Valley with Green-Winged Teal for a few years. Ron French will check the records for the complete history. Fred Means first found the bird.

I first paw the first there on February 11, 1989, with other Green-winged Teal sprinkled in the huge wasterfow? concentration (Canada Geese).

The next time I found the bird was December 27, 1989, and thereafter until January 13, 1990. There was significant ice cover and a large concentration of Canada Geese and a variety of other Water four including a White Fronkel Gover on December 28, 1989. The Green-Warsed Text and Common Text would be swimming in the water sheptispen by the high mass of geese or walking on the ice apparently picking at the copious droppings deposited there by the Goese.

The next sighting by me was January 26, 1991,
again with other Green-Winged Teal. Due to the mild winter,
the ice cover did not last long and although others saw the
bird shortly after the above date, I did not find the bird
again until March 2, 1891, at Pine Run Lake just south of
Reace Valley. I can only guess but it may be that
the bird is regularly seen at Reace Valley during
periods of severe ice cover but probably moves to
