Description

I was walking along an elevated access road between some impoundments when a few Savannah Sparrows flushed off the path ahead of me. Most looked like typical Savannah Sparrows but the one was very pale. I remember thinking, what is this pale thing going to be? I quickly got it in the binoculars and suspected it was an Ipswich Sparrow. I could see the pale gray back, brownish streaking on the underside and it appeared to be a little chunkier. It also looked more round-headed than the typical peaked-headed looking Savannah Sparrows. It flew ahead of me a couple times and I was able to get several pictures.

Feeding along path initially, then in flight and perched on weeds

Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)

The closest thing would be a Savannah Sparrow but the whole bird had a different look to it. I wanted to make sure it wasn't just a paler/leucistic "regular" Savannah but it was bulkier looking, had a rounded head, pale gray back and the brown streaks on the underside that are consistent with Ipswich.
