First saw the bird at my sunflower feeder. It was feeding from the tray on the feeder. Bird subsequently would come to the feeder every hour or so, and feed for 10-15 minutes then leave. It would come high into the tree, then work its way down to the feeder.

Bird observed from 4/16/12 - 4/20/12, then it was gone, but seen one last time at 158 Black Street on 5/02/12.

Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)

Black crown, black chin and pink bill separated this bird from White-throated and White-crowned sparrows, and House Sparrow.
