Subject: Shiny Cowbird - Adams Co.

PABirders,

On June 2, Linette Mansberger identified and photographed a male Shiny Cowbird at her feeders in Adams County. This is the first documented record of Shiny Cowbird for Pennsylvania, and one of few for the Northeast (there are records for Maine, Massachusetts, and Nova Scotia, as well as several mid-Atlantic records from Virginia and North Carolina).

After checking the identification and realizing the rarity of this species in the state, Linette submitted a report to eBird. When eBird reviewer Ramsay Koury requested documentation of this exceptional sighting, Linette sent in several photos that confirm the bird's identity as a Shiny Cowbird, showing its slim bill and a glossy purple & blue sheen to its black plumage. She hasn't seen the cowbird again since June 2, but will keep an eye out and let us know if it returns. The photos have been submitted to PORC for review & archival.
