



Description	This form is being filled out by me, Dave DeReamus, using the information provided to me by the observer. The attached two photos, sent to me by a non-birder named Jessie Serry, were taken with a Google Pixel 2 cell phone. They clearly show a sub-adult Brown Booby.
Behavior (be as detailed as possible about what the bird was doing)	Bird was perched on a stump on a wooded hillside. Go figure! Obviously, I wish I would have got the news the day before. Ugghhh!
Separation from similar species (How you eliminated others)	This is clearly a Brown Booby, showing the sharp demarcation line between the dark brown head and neck and the smudged-white belly, which eliminates the other booby species.
Discussion – anything else relevant to the observation that will aid the committee in evaluating it:	Again, I am submitting this for the non-birder who sent me these photos. Jessie and her husband, Tamer, were walking along Hillside Avenue with their 5-month old son when they noticed this "odd-looking" bird perched on a stump. I personally visited the site the next day and found the same exact stump in the photos, confirming the location of the sighting. This location is about a half-mile from the Delaware River and about 1-1/2 miles from the confluence of the Lehigh and Delaware Rivers (Forks of the Delaware).
